<u>Target Participants</u>	Children who have social communication difficulties despite typical intellectual and language abilities and their parents
<u>Synopsis</u> Outline how the course will better equip caregivers to look after their loved ones on a day to day basis <i>*propose format, between 50-150 words</i>	The social skills group utilises resources from Social Thinking®, the We Thinkers series. At the Child Development Unit, we offer a group programme (for children in K1 and K2) including a parent component for parents and caregivers. The program aims to teach children about social thinking concepts and vocabulary needed to make better decisions during social play and interaction. Parents will also learn how to explain these abstract concepts to them so that they are able to better support their child's learning at home.

<u>Learning Outcomes</u>	Parents will participate in workshop exercises and be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Better understand the frameworks of social thinking - Better understand how to help them child converse with one another - Learn about the concepts their child is being exposed to and start to use the same vocabulary at home - Identify routines that they may use and discuss how they may apply the concepts taught at home and in the community with guidance from trainers. - Learn and feel more confident about fostering shared imagination through pretend play with their child
